Reports

Sanamania/Regional Planning Meeting:

Attendants: Amanda D, Dave B and Kim, Bob, Pat, Jason, Ray, and Jesse K

Meeting lasted from 8pm to 9pm following the Lemars Tuesday Meeting 7pm at the Floyd Valley Hospital **April 6th SANA-MANIA Planning Meeting – Lemars, IA**

Next scheduled meetings: May 4th and June 1st

Topics Covered: Regional Meeting and Sanamania

LOCATION: We started the meeting by covering all aspects of the Regional Meeting. Jesse K informed everyone that he had spoke to Kim at the Floyd Valley Hospital at 546-3364 or 546-7871 and confirmed the reservation of the conference rooms

1, 2, and 3 located in the basement of the Hospital. He was informed that there is not a charge for the room when used for health related conferences but they would appreciate if we could try and use the cafeteria for any meals we would need to provide. Jesse had asked for the room for the entire day but Dave informed Jesse that the dietary person he spoke with thought it was only to be used until 3:30pm. Jesse talked to Kim on April 8th and confirmed with Kim that we can stay as long as it takes to complete the meeting. I said it should be done around 5:30 or 6pm.

LOCATION AMENITIES: Handicap Accessible, Clean, and Spacious which allows for multiple rooms to be created from one room. Bathrooms located outside the conference room as well as vending machines for pop or candy.

FOOD: Dave was given the dietary lady's phone number to discuss options for Breakfast and Lunch within our budget of \$150. Breakfast was found to be \$2 per person and \$5.50 per person for lunch. We have an estimate of about 50 people. We decided to use the cafeteria to provide breakfast which will be a continental. Dave will request 3 coffee and water carts for beverages. Jesse will get Orange Drink and Lemonade from McDonalds for \$5 each. This comes in a Large Water Cooler with ice. We would use the extra \$50 to provide the lunch. We decided upon Spaghetti, taverns, or Hamburgers. Jesse talked to Kim on April 8th and Kim said we can bring in an outside meal but that we would be responsible for making sure we clean up. If they provide meal then they clean up.

Amanda is to compare the price to prepare each kind of meal and bring it to the Sub-Committee prior to Area to vote on which we will serve.

ACCOMODATIONS: Amanda is going to call two local hotels in LeMars and pass information to Dave for creation of a flyer for Region. We of course will also inform them of the option to stay at the campout for the best option. They will also include my phone # to place reservations for a camping spot.

Flyer: Dave B is in charge of creating a Flyer for the Regional Meeting with directions, times, accommodations and contact info. He will disseminate these flyers to the area and the Region.

SANA-MANIA V

LOCATION: Jesse has sent in application and reserved the Shelter House for Friday June 4th at NOON until Sunday June 6th NOON. Jesse sent in the application to Jessica with the Chamber of Commerce of LeMars at phone # 548-4971. The cost is \$85/day for a total of \$170. Jesse did send in a \$30 deposit to hold the reservation which will be applied towards the rental fee. A \$50 deposit is needed when the key is picked up along with the balance of the two day rental. $\$170 - \$30(\text{deposit}) = \$140$ plus another check for \$50. Jesse will ask for reimbursement of \$30 as well as a check for \$140 and a check for \$50. The \$50 check is voided if we clean up properly. Jesse said there has never been a problem with them voiding the check and has never been charged anything for clean up.

CAMPING: Jesse has reserved the middle campground as usually and two RV spots. Jesse will call Dan Peters at the campground to verify prices. Last year it was \$10/tent (not per person) and \$17/night/RV. This reservation is for Friday and Saturday night and need to be gone by usually 3-4pm or so Sunday afternoon.

Main Speaker: We tried to get T-Bone to speak this year but since we changed the initial date he can no longer do it. He has a prior engagement. He is interested in speaking at it in the future. Jesse will call Tami B in Omaha for suggestions for a Speaker. We would like to get an outside speaker to help draw in more out of town visitors.

Itinerary: We took the flyer from last year and went over the itinerary and made a few changes: Listed below is what we came up with:

Friday we will have a 10pm Campfire Meeting as usual and just pretty much hang out and help people get set up.

Saturday: 10 AM Kids Activities will begin.

10:30 am we will have a Round Robin Meeting at the Shelter House

Noon we will have a Topic Meeting at the Shelter House

1pm we will start the Cowboy Golf Tournament

5:30 – 7:30pm we will have the BBQ \$5 all you can eat BBQ \$3 for children under 13.

9pm – 12 Midnight – Dance at the shelter house with a \$5 entry fee.

Theme/Slogan for the Campout: A Theme could not be agreed up for the campout so all who attended were asked to give it some thought and come to sub-committee with ideas. We would incorporate this theme or slogan into the flyers and t-shirts:

Flyers: Jesse K is in charge of creating a flyer with directions etc... Jesse will bring a generic flyer for the event to Area and have members bring back to groups. If any changes are made to the flyer a new flyer will be sent to Rob H to be dispersed to all Service members with the instruction of replacing the old flyer with the new. Jesse has created a Sign up sheet for people to volunteer to Chair meetings, run golf tournament, help with kid's activities etc... This will be passed around at Area for people to sign up. This will also be used at the next planning meeting to confirm who will be in charge of events etc...

T-Shirts: Tammy B from Omaha has created a Design for t-shirts and this was emailed to Amanda, Dave, and Jesse. Amanda sent out ideas for slogans/themes to Dave, Tami, and Jesse in the hopes of helping us create a Slogan to go with the design Tammy created. T-shirts are expected to be around \$10 like last year. Jesse Planned on paying for the shirts himself and just selling them. They are sold without a profit in mind. Just at cost. Jesse will ask area if this is something that Area would consider funding. Cost would be around \$300 for 30 t-shirts and I really think they would sell good. This is the amount that I think would be good to get based on last years overwhelming interest.

BBQ: The BBQ is currently set up for a HOG Roast. Jesse has confirmed that he can get a smoker from friend that is used just for Hog Roasts. Jesse will be in charge of cooking the hog and preparing the meat. Because of this he will need a lot of people to step up and volunteer to take charge of handling the meetings, getting DJ equipment, running cowboy golf tournament, etc...

Dance: Jesse has reserved the DJ equipment and asked DJ Jazzy Jes if he is available to do the dance. He said he will get to him on that. We will need people to bring raffle items. Jesse will donate a Cowboy Golf Set to be raffled.

FREE FISHING: Sarah had initially set up a SANA Fishing day/Hog Roast at Riverside Park in Sioux City for the same day. We asked if it would be OK to combine it with Sanamania. Sarah agreed to contact Riverside Park to see if they can get a refund on the park reservation. There will not be a formal organization in regards to the Fishing but it will be included on the Flyer for the Campout to remind everyone it is Free Fishing that weekend.

Collector Necklaces/itinerary: These will be sold for \$1 each and it lists the itinerary on one side and the Slogan/Artwork on the opposite and is put into a protective sleeve and worn around the neck on a string. These are very inexpensive and we did them at Sanamania I.

literature, then this request should be forwarded to the ASC for action.
